Maintenance Fundamentals

Periodic Checks

You should also perform other periodic maintenance checks at least once a month regardless of how often you ride, or more often if you ride frequently.

Also, check the odometer reading against the Maintenance Schedule and perform all maintenance that is due. ▶ P. 33

| Tires and | Check the air pressure (▶ P. 46), examine tread for wear and damage |
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| wheels | (▶ P. 46), and check the rims and spokes for damage. |

| Fluid levels | Check the engine oil level (➡ P. 57), and brake fluid level (➡ P. 64). |
| Lights | Check that the headlight, brake light, taillight and turn signals are working properly. |
| Controls | Check the freeplay of the clutch lever (► P. 74) and throttle grip (► P. 77). |
| Drive chain | Check the slack (♠ P. 68), adjust the slack (♠ P. 69), and lubricate (♠ P. 45) as needed. |
| Fuses | Check that you have a full supply of spare fuses. |
| Nuts & bolts | Check the major nuts and bolts, and tighten as needed. |
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
